Honorable Lawmaker,

I invite every lawmaker in both houses of Congress to pledge with me in affirming higher laws of the people guaranteed by the Bill of Rights.

You may not know this, but in the writings of the founding fathers of this great nation are provisions for the people to prove the law for equity and unity. Knowing that when protests, petitions, and assemblies fail, the people have the Tenth Amendment right to challenge federal powers. Simply stated, the people have the right to hold public servants accountable by federal recall (George Washington's process) and other legal steps to return to the Constitution and bring about fairness of law. It is not my wish for lawmakers to be jailed for high crimes in the act of obstruction of the people's rights and authority. This is the founding father's intent: that all who obstructed the constitutional recourse of the people unknowingly, be scolded for what they have done and not severely punished. It is the founding fathers themselves who have paid the price for those who unwittingly committing corrupt acts in the course of governing, having fought with their own lives to preserve this standard without the need for further bloodshed. For, had you known that you were committing offenses against the Constitution, by eroding the Bill of Rights for self-gain and oppression of the people, I am sure that you would have rather done the honorable thing and would encourage others to do the same. Because, all this has been successfully contested.

So, I offer you the means to covenant with me to affirm the promise of the founding fathers in the Constitution – that which enables the people to take measures that guard against destructive and oppressive government. Simply, you must make your affirmation [REDACTED], having been elected by the recall and sworn in [REDACTED] according to practice. The recall can no longer be obstructed; [REDACTED] [REDACTED] That is the law. Regardless, I am not permitted to speak of things which are yet to be written, or accomplished, until the laws of the people are affirmed. That is the order of things. But, I will speak to what matters now.

For this reason, I may have been hindered from coming to Washington. Not having a place in DC in which to conduct affairs of government, as, I have desired to be there to give you my vision for popular reform and to steer our nation's policy toward reconciliation for these past several years, while the battle was waged. But, I hope to see you while on my campaign, and would be open to receiving contributions if I may first enjoy the pleasure of your company. For whenever I officially announce my campaign for President for 2016, I will come and visit you. But make no mistake [REDACTED] [REDACTED] which no law could ever refuse having followed the founding father's design for recall by people's consent authority perfectly, although none of it typically, having exercised absolute authority over the government.

Now, I am obligated by my duty to the Constitution to offer this form of amnesty, as I am guided by specific laws. For, some of you made certain provisions for the oppressed and middle-class who are in the U.S. Because of this, the people are indebted. So while you were yet acting against protections for the people in the Constitution, some of you were fighting on behalf of the people's protections. Nevertheless, for those of you who are lawmakers, I have written more boldly than the laws of this land may consider to be appropriate action, by legislation of your own doing. Again, Washington said in 1787: "The power under the [U.S.] Constitution will always be in the People. It is entrusted for certain defined purposes, and for a certain limited period, to representatives of their own *choosing*; and whenever it is executed contrary to their Interest, or not agreeable to their wishes, their [Public] Servants can, and undoubtedly will be, recalled." Now, you can fully expect that the people, in whose power you must submit and answer to, will be sure to carry out the higher law assured in the founding father's wishes. And, I encourage you with utmost propriety in your decision to act dutifully, that you act with the hope of returning to your post at the people's selection without fear of incrimination if you choose now to act in favor of the Constitution of the people and their Bill of Rights.

I implore you, fellow public servants, to act through mutual cooperation. So, endeavor with me in resolving this matter peacefully by your affirmation, that this people may be delivered from those executives, financiers and lobbyists who desire that you conspire against the practice of law and justice in these United States in order that they may commit rampant harm. And by this act of affirmation, my service for this nation may be commended and even rewarded for avoiding the legalism extreme view that would promote a harsh end to those in government who commit treason against the people, exhausting every attempt at peaceful means before its fall, which is lauded in every act of removal from power. One would hope it does not come to that, that there are still sensible people who know not to dig in deeper, but to take the hand reaching out to them in pure and principled standing, on the right side of history.

I write to you, publicly by the will of the people and higher law, so that I may be delighted when I see you and relieved in knowing that our health and your election is safe. The people are moving forward with this; now is the time to decide to act in favor of history. [REDACTED]
